Unfortunately, it feels like the education sector is under attack at the moment and I wanted to offer some reassurance that while the negative narratives on Te Tiriti, the hastened curriculum changes, and the Teaching Council takeover tactics by decision-makers in Wellington occur, we remain steadfast in doing what's best for our tamariki and school whānau. Some of these decisions are unlikely to affect our school directly but they will no doubt affect other schools and the future generations of decision-makers, particularly the Te Tiriti clause - essentially, reversing the progress that has been made in the relationship between Māori and non-Māori. It is sad to see the division that these decisions have had on our sector and on our country as whole. We are fortunate to have committed staff who support and tautoko the school management's aspirations of steering our ākonga towards a cohesive synonymous goal of upholding quality education and mātauranga māori.
